Background:-


This matter is referred by the Government requesting the Commission to enquire the matter. In this matter, Advocate, Shri Shashikant Pawar, Chairman Akhil Bhartiya Maratha Sangh has send a letter to then Chief Minister of Government of Maharashtra, demanding the compensation of Rs.11/- lakhs to the family of girl age 15 year who was in the elation with the scheduled caste boy and due to this, the boy was murdered by the crowd.

2. As girl child is in trauma and her family is suffering lot, therefore, her family should be compensated, as demanded in the letter.
3. Commission listed matter, called complainant and District Women and Child Development Officer. Complainant never appeared. District Child Welfare Committee and Women Child Development Officer, Ahmednagar has submitted report saying that compensation cannot be given in this matter either under any scheme or law. Protection Officer and Probationary Officer have visited the house of child and asked for education of child under the scheme run by the department. However, it shall be informed after discussing in detailed with parent.

3. Under the Child Right Commission Act, provision of compensation is provided in case of deprivation of right of child. As in this case, girl child is in trauma, the right has also been violated, therefore, a detailed report is needed in this case from the District Child Protection Unit and on the basis of report of District Child Protection Unit quantum of compensation shall be decided and accordingly recommendation is made.
