Background:-

This matter came before the Commission by filing a complaint against Principal of Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Shegaon, Chincholi, Dist. Buldana, Maharashtra, stating that complainant Shri Panjabrao Vikram Nemade, who was selected to get the admission in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Shegaon, Chincholi is being tortured mentally and physically by the School's Authority.

2. Keeping view that school is established by Government of India. Hence, he has allowed to carry on his son's education in the School. However, he is being mistreated by his Class Teacher, Shri Vanjare, by various ways on 4th January, 2012. It is further stated that, the telephone message was received from Shri Vanjare, saying that he is supposed to submit a bond paper stating that Class

Teacher could not be responsible, if any, incident would happen in course of education of his son.

3. The Commission took the cognizance, directed to issue notices and call the Principal of the School. Principal of the School has filed a reply, saying that allegation made by complainant is false, vague and afterthought. The Jawahar Navodya Vidyalaya is residential school imparting quality education after providing all the facilities. Second son of the complainant was also studying in the same school. However, son of the complainant is suffering from home sickness. Therefore, his elder brother was also left within a couple of month after admission. The child was never punished. No such complaint is received during his stay in the Vidyalalya. Now the boy is studying in the village school. The House Master, Shri Vanjare belonged to S. C. Community. Therefore, there is no case of covering the provision of S.C/S.T. Act. The Principal has requested to set aside the complaint filed by complainant. Complainant did not turn up.

4. Under above circumstances, the Commission is relying on the reply filed by Principal, therefore, disposing the matter without any recommendation.
